## DEER RESISTANT PERENNIALS

For areas where deer are a problem, we have created a list of perennials that deer do not seem to eat. The normal problem is even if the deer do not eat the plant they pull it up and drag it off across the lawn where you find it some time later dried out. There is no fixed advice in what to do about hungry deer in the garden, big dog, human hair, and zest soap. All have been tried with limited success. The best way to combat the herd is to plant smart, using plants known to not suit the deer pallet.
